Recycle these empty, rinsed **CONTAINERS** : metal cans, foil, metal lids; glass bottles, jars and broken ceramic dishes; paper milk cartons & juice boxes; and plastic bottles marked with a #1 (PETE) or #2 (HDPE) (bottles typically used for water & sports drinks, milk or laundry detergents). *NO other plastics besides bottles numbered 1&2. No foam, plastic bags, tubs, food trays, etc.*

Recycle these mixed **PAPERS**: newspapers, magazines, catalogs, phone books, paperback books, envelopes, junk mail, paper bags, cereal-type boxes (empty & flattened), and **flattened corrugated cardboard**. *No paper tissues, napkins, candy wrappers, food, or paper cups.*

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

- Remove & discard all stuffing
- Flatten & cut or fold into 2' x 3' Tie or tape into 6" bundles.
- Staples & tape are OK
- Place next to recycling bin

DUMPSTER TRASH COLLECTION

Large apartment buildings usually use dumpsters for trash. Recyclables are generally collected in large wheeled carts parked near the dumpster. Don't block the dumpster with vehicles or trash. You can be ticketed and towed.

CURBSIDE COLLECTION

Many houses and smaller apartment buildings put A2 Carts and recycling bins on the curb before 7 a.m. for weekly collection.

- **ALL TRASH must fit into the cart and recyclables in the recycling bins** (plus flattened, bundled cardboard).
- Broken bags, loose trash, furniture, etc. must be cleaned up by the occupant or be subject to Clean Community fines.
- Solid waste containers must be stored at the side or rear of the dwelling and not placed at the curb more than 24 hours ahead of time. Empty trashcans must be removed from the curb by Noon the day after collection.
- Your weekly collection day is listed on the City's web site (see below).
- You must make your own arrangements to dispose of large items, furniture and appliances. These will not be picked up automatically.

BULKY ITEMS DISPOSAL fact sheet at a2gov.org/recycle

Residents and businesses must make their own arrangements to properly dispose of bulky items, such as sofas, appliances, mattresses, broken television, rolls of carpeting, furniture, computer and surplus trash that does not fit into the A2 Carts.

- Waste items are accepted for-free disposal at the Drop-Off Station (see DOS information below).
- Private haulers are listed in the print & online "yellow pages" under "Rubbish & Garbage Removal" or similar terms.
- Some haulers are listed as WasteKnot Partners with Washtenaw County (also at www.a2gov.org/recycle).
- *The listing of these haulers is not and does not imply an endorsement of their services or products by the City of Ann Arbor or by any City of Ann Arbor official or employee.*
- Abandoned bulky wastes are subject to fines.
